A maximum combined total of 8 hours of ANT 397 (Directed Readings), ANT 495 (Honors), and ANT 497 (Undergraduate Research) may be applied toward the major. No courses taken using the S/U option may be applied toward the major. A maximum of 12 credit hours (3 courses) *earned off campus* may be applied toward the major. Petitions for course substitutions and exceptions will be considered by the Undergraduate Concerns Committee. *A.P./Transfer credit* for math, science, and statistics foundations is accepted if it has already been approved by the appropriate department and appears on the transcript. The following advanced courses may be substituted for the foundations outside the department listed on the reverse: Biology—BIO 151, BIO 152; Math —MATH 112, MATH 115, MATH 116.
